As I write this I am only hours away from my summer holiday; I have anticipated this for weeks and I have many hopes and expectations of my time away: the sun will shine; the people will be welcoming; the food delicious and I will completely 'switch off' and return refreshed. I have no guarantees that any of my expectations will be fulfilled but I go in anticipation of enjoying myself and even if none of the above comes to pass I aim to have a good holiday!

September is the time of year for expectations; it is when many new beginnings occur: our young people start or change schools, some go off to college or university and live away from home for the first time; for others it is a time to begin a new job; to stand on the precipice of a fresh start and to step forward in faith. These can be exciting times but also scary for as we anticipate what is to come we also know that not all of our hopes will be fulfilled. However, for all things may not work out as we planned that should not stop us going ahead.

So what about our churches? September is the start of the Methodist year. Do we have expectations for this New Year? Do we anticipate that God will be at work in our activities; that our worship will be inspired by the presence of God; that Jesus will still call people from their daily lives to follow him? Or will we continue as we have always done without really expecting God's presence to inspire or challenge?

My grandad used to tell the story of a railway signaller who manned the gates of a level crossing. Sometimes he would leave one gate open and the other closed and when asked why would reply 'well, I was only half expecting a train!' Are we the same in our faith: we profess that we are the Body of Christ but do we only half expect to realise the presence of Christ in our communities? What are our expectations for the coming year?

At the Methodist Conference this year the new president Rev Steve Wild set the Methodist church a challenge: He expects every church in the course of the next year to make one new member. He said this: "We have a massive Kingdom of God task. I'm wanting this year to challenge each church to bring one person to faith - to make one new member this next year, let's make bringing people to faith the main point, we don't do it alone. The unconditional love of Jesus is our motivation."

Is this a totally unrealistic expectation or a priority to work towards and to pray for? Do we begin with all that we cannot do, or anticipate the possibilities of how we might share our faith in the communities that we serve? Things may not work out as we hope; but let us be a people who always expects to see God's presence in the world and anticipates that He still has a purpose for his church in the Vale of Aylesbury Methodist Circuit.

Chinnor Methodist Church has made good progress with fund-raising for the refurbishment of the chapel. We have so far reached a total of £132,000 towards our target of £215,000. Now we need your help to push this on to the next stage.

We estimate that we will need 1760 bricks to build the re-designed entrance hall and we are proposing an “adopt-a-brick” scheme. We suggest that each brick should cost £10. There is no upper limit on the number of bricks any individual may wish to adopt.

COVER STORY

WEEDON and HARDWICK LEP



The Church in Hardwick was built in the 12th century and sited on the edge of the village nearest to Weedon.

Methodism came to Weedon in the 1770s and two Methodist Chapels were built in the 19th century.



Additionally a part of the Weedon village school was consecrated and services regularly held there thus easing the burden of travelling to Hardwick twice a day for services.

When Ann Varker was Minister, covering Weedon, discussions were held with the Anglicans which led to the formation of the Local Ecumenical Partnership that has been running now for over 5 years. We are now moving towards a sharing agreement.

The services are planned such that on the 1st and 3rd Sunday in the month, there is a service in Hardwick at 9.30 a.m. and 6.00 p.m. in Weedon.

On the 2nd Sunday, a Family Service is held at 9.30 a.m. in Weedon Chapel which regularly attracts about 65 villagers including about 15 children who get involved in the service.. On the 4th Sunday there is Family Communion Service in Hardwick and a Sunday school for the youngsters. The 5th Sunday we join in rotation the Chapels in Whitchurch and Wingrave. Every Thursday morning at 10.00 a.m. a Communion Service is held in the Old Schoolroom in Weedon.

FAIRTRADE MATTERS

As you may have noticed, in keeping with the Circuit's Fair trade policy, I have been taking along Fairtrade goods to a number of events such as the Open Air Service, the cluster service in Princes Risborough and Circuit services. This is only possible with the co-operation of the local organisers and stewards alongside a bit of packing and unpacking. If you would like to have specific items provided please let me know and I will endeavour to get them to you / bring them along.

If you have queries or doubts about the value and purpose of Fairtrade please ask. Fairtrade is not a panacea to issues of poverty but it can provide a relief and a basis for individuals to work their way into improved circumstances. Small and modest purchases made by you all add up to give significant benefits.

Fairtrade is not a charity but the nature of its practices and philosophy could be seen as charitable in that it guarantees a price for goods for the producer alongside adding a premium payment. In doing so it allows for the producer not only to plan ahead but allows communities to develop resources such as education and improvements in health. There is a recognised link between good nutrition, educational improvement and life expectancy, so it is not just about trade.

It cannot have gone unnoticed there are currently comments that the desire to move to Europe is stimulated by individuals wanting to better their lives. As such the ideals behind Fairtrade are about allowing individuals to improve their lives in their communities.

FAIRTRADE Products -

Statistics indicate the majority of the population recognise the Fairtrade symbol. This is really good news.

However there still seem to be misunderstandings about Fairtrade.

Please remember Fairtrade

- is not a product line in its own right:

- is a philosophy for sourcing and trading a product.

- goods are sourced from a wide range of producers.

- products come with many different tastes.

- pays a fair price for the production costs

- means the producer is not subsidising the product for others to use.

There will be a taste you like out there for you somewhere: if you have found one you like why not shout about it?

The basis of plan making is the gathering in of information from two sources;

1. From our preachers as to when they are available.
2. From our Churches about special services they wish to have and preachers they have invited.

To try and make the data gathering more reliable it has been decided that we will use a system devised by the ThenMedia Company, this will be an integral part of a new Circuit Website about to be built using their Chrestos system.

Preachers who normally provide availability information will be asked to complete an 'Availability Form' by a **due date** each quarter. The form is available as a page on the internet which is easy to log in to and easy to complete. Saving the form automatically puts the information into the Chrestos system –

No special software or computer skill is required.

Nominated church officers will also be asked to log in, find their church on a list and type in the details of their service plans for the quarter – exactly as they would do when sending an Email. Saving the notes in Chrestos makes them automatically available to the Plan Makers.

More details are available to those who will be involved in either of the above activities. It is intended to use this system to assist the generation of all Preaching Plans for 2016 and future years.

Sending data in by Email will still be possible but that will be less secure, will not put the data where it is needed and will need to be done well before the due date to allow time to transfer it.
