#### LETTER TO THE CIRCUIT



#### **Rev Helen Kirk**

"My thoughts," says the LORD, "are not like yours, and my ways are different from yours.

As high as the heavens are above the earth, so high are my ways and thoughts above yours" (Isaiah 55. 8,9)

When I came across this inscription from the Bible on the wall of a small village church my initial thoughts where 'thank goodness for that!' What a relief to know that God's thoughts and ways are not bound by human self-interest and greed. You only have to open a newspaper to find the evidence of human beings' capacity to inflict violence and pain or to corrupt or destroy. It can be depressing reading. So when the prophet states that our ways are not God's ways it begs the question: What is 'God's way'? The problem is that over the centuries many who have claimed to be acting for God have committed terrible atrocities: war, torture, repression and racism. Such actions have all been perpetrated in the name of God by people who have taken a small portion of the Scriptures and fitted it to their agenda regardless of the breadth of God's grace expressed elsewhere. For when you look for the bigger (and better) picture of 'God's ways' you find it is the way of grace, unconditional love, forgiveness, selfsacrifice, justice-seeking, hope-giving, barrier-crossing and peace-making. Something to inspire us to be better human beings.

But it also made me wonder if this church's inscription was lived up to? How often in the life of the church do we seek 'God's ways' instead of trying to fit him to our own agendas? For example are our administrative structures – church councils and meetings etc. - held with the intention of sharing God's grace or are we concerned with budgets, maintaining property and filling offices?

Does the way we use our resources - time, money, and gifts first and foremost lift up the lowly and feed those who hunger in so many ways?

Are our ordained clergy and lay leaders pressed for time because they are maintaining churches just as we like them or because they are seeking the lost, lonely and unloved beyond the church?

I realise I am being deliberately provocative but it does beg the question of where we begin in our mission, worship & witness: is it with how things are or with God's purpose for his Church? Is it with our preferences or with God's love for his creation? Perhaps together, through prayerful reflection, we might seek God's way afresh for us today and for the future.

# Prayer

God of the unexpected crash through our assumptions God, whose friends break through boundaries of preconceived ideas and rules, challenge us with your grace God whose life is written in bold strokes of love beyond anything we can predict or dream give us a larger vision of your hope for the church and the word. Give us hearts full of compassion and the courage to walk the

way of Jesus

We wait on your inspiration today and every day. Amen.

Our mission as a congregation is "sharing God's love in word and deed" and we do our best to put this into practice both within the village and further afield.

For many years now we have supported the Whitechapel Mission, which plays an important role in feeding and clothing the homeless in the East End of London. Work parties from Wingrave regularly visit the Mission to cook breakfast and sort donated clothes, and we are often joined on these visits by our friends from the Parish Church as part of our "Wingrave Churches Together" activities.

We also fundraise for Whitechapel and other charities such as the Karibuni Trust and Action for Children at our weekly "Nup End Café" where Wingrave people aged from 18 months to over 90 come to enjoy soup and pudding as well as each others' company.

Further afield our congregation supports a number of overseas charities both financially and in kind. In November we collected together a total of 84 shoeboxes of Christmas gifts, and

knitted a number of teddy bears, which were sent via "Link to Hope" to people in Eastern Europe including Romania.

Back home in Wingrave we have an active congregation and we are always pleased to welcome the many visiting preachers who lead our services and share God's word.



# A notice to all Regular Preachers and Church Stewards re the Chrestos Planning Tools

## CHINNOR METHODIST CHURCH NEEDS YOU ADOPT-A-BRICK

Chinnor Methodist Church has made good progress with fundraising for the refurbishment of the chapel. We have so far reached a total of £132,000 towards our target of £215,000. Now we need your help to push this on to the next stage.

We estimate that we will need 1760 bricks to build the re-designed entrance hall and we are proposing an "adopt-a-brick" scheme. We suggest that each brick should cost £10. There is no upper limit on the number of bricks any individual may wish to adopt.


