PASTORIAL LETTER

A few months ago, we were up in Hull for my parents' 60th wedding anniversary. It was a lovely celebration of my mum & dad's life together; a chance for all the generations of one family to be under one roof (quite an achievement when you consider it involves 4 children, 11 grandchildren and currently 12 great grandchildren); it was also a chance to meet Mum & Dad's friends, some of whom I knew and others who I had only heard of but felt I knew. You see although I hadn't met them I had heard so much about them: I knew that John didn't like spicy food; grew his own vegetables; had a son living in Australia and walked everywhere. I knew that Margaret had had an operation on her hand; used to be a teacher of special needs children and lived with her daughter & two grandchildren; I knew that Dorothy loved ballroom dancing, did yoga three times a week and was getting married for the 4th time. I knew all of this despite only meeting them for the first time at the party; I knew them because my parents had told me all about them; they were always sharing stories of the people they spend their time with.

There is nothing unusual in this; we tell stories of those who are part of our lives all the time, but it did make me wonder why we are so reluctant to share the stories we have of another friend; one who is part of our lives, one who is important to us and makes a huge difference to us – Jesus.

Why, when we willingly share stories of other friends, is Jesus the friend we keep quiet about? Do we fear that people will think we're bonkers? As if we still had an imaginary friend?

And yet we declare on Sundays that this relationship matters. Is it our upbringing? Good manners have taught us that we should never talk about religion in polite company? Yet isn't this one relationship that defines our life more than any other?

A few months later I found myself at a social event with a glass of wine in my hand (don't tell the Methodists!) and someone asked me what I did for a living; I told them, and after all the usual comments about 'But Christians are miserable and shouldn't be at a party!' I was asked why I was a minister.

At this point I usually stumble around talking vaguely about God and the church and calling but this time I simply said, 'because of Jesus.'

My companion's answer surprised me: 'Tell me about Jesus'. And so, I did. I told him about my fascination with Jesus; the things he had said and done, and the impact Jesus had had on my life. My companion thanked me and replied 'That was the first time anyone has ever told me anything about Jesus'.

Now, I don't think for a minute my companion became a Christian on the strength of my words; maybe he will take away my stories of Jesus and recollect them at another time – a mustard seed growing in his life? What I do know is that it felt really good to talk about a friend; a friend who I love, who challenges my life to be better, who offers me strength and courage when I have none, who brings great joy to my life; it was liberating to share a story about my friend with another.

This year as a circuit we will be continuing to think about how we share our faith both as churches and as individuals. We will share ideas and develop strategies; hold meetings and create growth plans and hopefully this will be inspiring and exciting. However, in the middle of all this policy-making let us not forget that we all have a story to share; a friend to tell others about because, at the end of the day, that's all evangelism really is.

On Wednesday 29th August about 150 people gathered at Stewkley Chapel to celebrate the life of, and to say farewell to, Stan Gibbons who had, after a short while in hospital passed away peacefully on 7th August. Methodist Church. The service was conducted by Rev Dr Jonathan Hustler, ably assisted by Rev Donna Broadbent-Kelly and a short tribute was given by Mervyn Appleby.

I am sure they and many local preachers appreciated his help and support which were always happily given.

Stan and his wife Pam moved to Stewkley over forty years ago when he was working as a quantity surveyor for the company dealing with Milton Keynes centre and have remained in the same house ever since.

We all have our own special memories of Stan, who was always good company, very welcoming and a very good friend. Aside from his service to the Methodist Church he had a great interest in sport. He was a lifelong supporter of Arsenal Football Club, a keen cricket fan and member of Middlesex County Cricket Club, he also loved to play golf, becoming a member of Aylesbury Vale Golf Club when he retired. Stan could always be relied upon to tell many interesting stories involving his personal sporting experiences, his life in general and his association with the Methodist Church

BIG THANKS FROM AYLESBURY

When last October's Circuit Meeting supported a £20,000 grant application for Aylesbury's Church Welcome Project they started a very welcome trend. Since then, the £105,000 programme to revamp the church welcome area at Buckingham Street has received further grants from our Northampton District and the wider Methodist Connexion. Other generous support has come from WREN, and Allchurches Trust. Including our own fund-raising so far, this now totals £93,000, enabling us to start the work.



The common denominator for all the grants is the fact that this is not just about improving the appearance of the front of the church and coffee bar, though it will do that. More important is that it will enable us to increase our outreach and enrich the lives of many more people within the town centre and wider communities we seek to serve. How we aim to do that is set out in the brochure we presented to the circuit meeting and our other funders. The Methodist Church's Connexional Grants Committee (CGC), in awarding us the full amount we had requested, said, "The property stream of the CGC were very enthusiastic about your project."



Similar sentiments were expressed by WREN, a not-for-profit business that awards grants for community, biodiversity and heritage projects from funds donated by FCC Environment through the Landfill Communities Fund. Established in 1997, WREN has provided over £200m to more than 7,000 community and environmental projects throughout the UK. Penny Horne WREN's local grant manger says: "We are delighted to be supporting the Aylesbury Methodist Church Welcome Project and pleased that our funding from WREN's FCC Community Action Fund will provide such a fantastic facility for the local community. WREN is always happy to consider grant applications for projects that make a difference to local communities and we're really looking forward to seeing this one take shape soon."



Allchurches Trust welcomes inspiring applications from a wide range of organisations promoting Christian principles, our Christian heritage and the good of society. Allchurches Trust Grants Officer, Jeremy Noles, said: "We're really pleased to have been able to offer our support to this project, which will provide a warm and welcoming place for the whole community to come together and a listening ear for those who need it. We were particularly impressed with Aylesbury Methodists' plans to reach out to those who may be feeling isolated or who are struggling within the local area and enable them to connect both with each other in the church space and with the wider world through free internet access."

On timing, we aim to receive tenders back by mid-October, appoint a builder by the end of November, start work early January and complete by Easter. So when you come to support the 34th annual organ concert on 8th May 2019, organised by Derrick Matthews and featuring Jonathan and Tom Scott on organ and piano, you can all see the physical changes that your Circuit funding has helped to create. Our plans to deliver our outreach initiatives will be a future topic for this magazine. So thank you for your help thus far and we will appreciate your continued prayerful support.
