

HARVEST FESTIVAL SERVICE – 10th October 2021

During the pandemic the Mission remained open, because they were the only place open, and because some folk were not permitted to use hotel accommodation provided by the government; so they were extra busy. They felt a need to not only provide breakfast but also a packed lunch. Because all meals had to be taken away, sustainable packaging was required and they turned to the use of bamboo.

Approximately 600 meals a day were provided: the estimate is 315,425 so far, at a cost of £1.2 million - up from the normal budget of £700,00.

People's generosity meant that this amount was covered!

The pandemic has seen the closure of 34 churches that normally support the mission at harvest time so our generosity is needed more than ever.
