PASTORIAL LETTER



Rev Helen Kirk

I have often had the question 'what is a Methodist?' but I was slightly taken aback when the question was 'Why are you a Methodist?'

Well, I'm a Methodist because that's the church my mum & dad went to and made me go....even when I didn't want to!

I'm a Methodist because as a teenager this was the church with the best youth group and it was fun.

I'm a Methodist because I like a good sing, the people are friendly and caring and there's always tea and cake......

I'm a Methodist because the values of community, justice and meeting social needs are important to me.

All this is true but really I am still a Methodist because it was amongst the Methodist people I discovered Jesus.

However it was a long time before anyone introduced us. I belonged, sang, ate cake and took part in events for many years before anyone told me that this was personal; that the story of Jesus was really a story of the deep deep love that God had for me and his creation. And when I realised how much I was loved, I was shocked and disturbed; it changed my life.

I honestly think without that introduction, without Jesus, I would have drifted away from the Methodist church. I would have had many fond memories of the church; no doubt I would have still wanted to get married there and possibly have my children baptised there; I would probably carry the values of justice and integrity but that would have been it. I would have been like the countless others who say they have 'a Methodist background' but no real faith.

So I thank God that someone had the courage, a long time ago, to talk to me about what they knew of Jesus.

I have realised this summer that I have completed 20 years in ministry and in those 20 years I have been involved in many initiatives: courses on faith; community outreach projects; fresh expressions of church; alternative acts of worship all designed to engage people with Christianity. They are all good and valid forms of outreach but I do wonder sometimes if we would be better simply explaining what it is about Jesus that makes us follow him; if we introduced people genuinely to the Jesus we know. As we begin the new Methodist year with all the flurry of activity that it involves may we not forget why we do what we do and maybe, just maybe, we might have the courage to tell someone WHO we do it all for.....not for the church but for God who loves us so much through Jesus.








CREATING THE CIRCUIT PREACHING PLAN

You may recall having seen the Flow Diagram below in a previous issue, it is of course meant to be a joke.

As a representation of what Supers used to go through it was, and may be still is for some, too near reality to be funny. Fortunately we have moved on and the Super only loses a few nights sleep! Part of the problem was the fact that the information arrived in so many forms that there was a good chance of it being lost, forgotten or misunderstood.



Some sections of the Circuit Website form a facility to assist the preparation of the Preaching Plan, these are collectively known as the CHRESTOS Tools (generally known just as CHRESTOS) which allow the participation of **all** involved with the Plan preparation; the whole operation is controlled by the Superintendent Minister. Chrestos enables regular preachers to input their available dates on line by completing a simple form. The system builds a data base showing when and where each preacher will be available. Some Visiting Preachers need to be invited in the traditional way; Chrestos has a list of VPs who have preached in the Circuit recently. Nominated Local Church Officers, normally a Steward, can submit information on special services, invited preachers, changes of service times, etc. again using a simple form on line. A **deadline** is set for all this information to be entered.

CHRESTOS puts all the information in one place and in writing but any system is only as good as the information it receives!

After the deadline the system is switched to Planning Mode and makes a Planning Grid available to the Plan Admin Team, which once had to meet to deal with all the paperwork, but now operates on-line.

Ministers can fill in their own appointments in their own area on the Planning grid which is effectively an online version of the Plan. The Super then fills the vacant appointments using the information from CHRESTOS

This online system, which we started using seriously for the Jan-March Plan in 2016, has reduced plan preparation from weeks to days. We are still on a learning curve and still hoping for 100% cooperation from the churches.

When the grid is complete it is converted to our traditional publication format and a draft put on the website for anyone to make comment upon.

A final version is normally on line and ready for printing in 7-10 days after that but that depends upon folk being **alert and responsive** to promptings on the website and in Emails.
