From the Manse ...

Dear Friends, I hope you all had a joyful Christmas and that this new year brings blessings to each one of us.



As I write this in the middle of January, I'm reminded of how

challenging it can be to navigate these uncertain times. Yet, the beginning of a new year always feels like a special moment—a chance to reflect, find hope, and start anew. For us, as Christians, it's also a time to think about how we mark this fresh beginning with faith.

The Beatles famously sang, "All you need is love," and February is a month when love often takes centre stage. Many of us celebrate St. Valentine's Day by expressing affection for our loved ones. But historically, Valentine's Day wasn't just about romantic love. It was also a time to honour love in all its forms—between parents, children, siblings, friends, and, most importantly, the love of God for His creation. But have you ever thought about how conditional human love can be? Are there things that could cause someone to stop loving us? If we're honest, the answer is probably yes. Human love, while beautiful, is often imperfect.

God's love, however, is entirely different. It is unconditional and unchanging. Nothing we do can make God love us more, or less. While our actions may distance us from God, they can never separate us from His love. God's love is the purest and most profound we could ever know. As Valentine's Day celebrates love, March also marks the beginning of Lent—a season when we reflect on the ultimate expression of love: God's gift of His Son, Jesus Christ. John 3:16 reminds us of this truth: *"For God so loved the world that He gave His one and only Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish but have eternal life."* (NIV). This February, may you feel deeply loved—not just by those around you but by the God who loves you unconditionally. As Alexander MacLaren beautifully said: "God's love is not drawn out by our lovableness but wells up, like an artesian spring, from the depths of His nature." Let this truth encourage you: God's amazing love for you is constant and eternal.

As we step into this new year, we have the chance to leave behind the burdens of the past. Whatever challenges or sorrows 2024 brought, that chapter has closed. Of course, no one knows exactly what the future holds. There will be moments of joy and moments of difficulty—for us as individuals, as a nation, and as a church. But one thing is certain: God will be with us on every step.

As we journey through 2025, let's place God at the centre of our lives. May we echo the words of the Covenant Prayer: "I am no longer my own but yours. Put me to what you will, place me with whom you will..." Whatever lies ahead—whether challenges or opportunities—let us trust God to guide and strengthen us. Let's seek His will and remain faithful in our relationship with Him.

As we begin this new year, may we walk in faith, trusting God's hand to lead us through whatever comes next. Amen. 3

CTR : Churches Together in Risborough

The main focus in recent weeks centred on the weekend of Nov 30^{th} / Dec 1^{st} .
