From the Manse ...



Easter is on the 1st April this year and so you may be reading this after the pinnacle of the Christian year is now behind us. With our Easter celebrations over I wait with baited breath for the first shop to start advertising Christmas, that is of course after they have had a sale of Easter eggs. But it is a long time before the secular world will engage once again with the Christian calendar. So what next? Do we just tidy up the shiny paper and coloured boxes that our own Easter eggs came in and wait patiently for Halloween or 5th November? The answer, of course, is 'no'.

So what do we do? Or perhaps more importantly, why do we do it? In June we will have our Circuit Consultation which will focus on how we plan for the future, how we plan for growth. The questions we need to ask ourselves are familiar ones:

Why do we exist?

What is our purpose for being?

Have we any specific objectives in our work for God in this place?

I believe it is time for the church to cast a new vision. We have just celebrated the risen Christ, what does that mean to us as a church and as individuals? Princes Centre Update - March 2018

We hope we have seen the back of the cold winter and that warmer spring weather arrives soon. The recent snow meant that in the interests of health and safety, the centre was closed for two days.



With the encouragement of Bucks County Council, who wish to see the success of the Princes Centre replicated throughout the county; the trustees have recently finalised the transfer of operations of the Bourne End Day Centre from the Freemantle Trust, and we are now overseeing the running of that Centre. The existing clients are very pleased with all the new activities that have been introduced and numbers are steadily increasing. It is anticipated that this additional undertaking will eventually be very beneficial to the Princes Centre.

There have been several meetings with community groups in Bourne End and it is envisaged that they will give good support for this centre; and already they have received three generous donations from community leaders towards purchasing more equipment for clients' use. None of the support we receive from our local community will be channelled to Bourne End.

The Princes Centre recently hosted the Rotary Club Film Night, providing a dinner for the members. Princes Risborough Rotary Club have been staunch supporters of the Princes Centre over the five years we have been operating. Other community groups may also wish to consider requesting a get-together and evening meal here. We just provide home-cooking, nothing too fancy, but the price per head can be very reasonable in comparison with restaurants. Mid-day lunches are also available.

We had some Buckinghamshire County Council youth workers recently entertaining our clients, and one of the activities, a clever catch ball, was such a great hit, that it will be repeated.

We recently received some very welcome donations from the Risborough and District Community Association, The Black Dog Band and Banjovi Revival and from residents of Bledlow, who attended a community lunch. All the donations are ring-fenced for use in upgrading the buildings of the Princes Centre. Now the toilet upgrading is completed, a small but very useful cupboard has been built in the entrance hall, which will house wheelchairs and walking frames. Although not a very big project, it involved the re-siting of a radiator and has enabled a lot of other pipe work from the adjacent room to be hidden from view.

Tuesday Fellowship

At our Fellowship meeting in February we were very pleased to welcome Jeanne Stephens and her Guide Dog, 'Breck'. Jeanne told us all about her life being blind, how she ran a Pre-school, took photographs which she passed around for us all to see, made cards and did many other things. She told us how much she relied on her Guide Dog. 'Breck' made himself comfortable lying at Jeanne's feet and when we were having our refreshments made himself a friend of everybody there. We gave Jeanne a donation of £40, which she wished to go to 'Guide Dogs for the Blind', and an acknowledgement has been received from them with their grateful thanks.

Morning service:

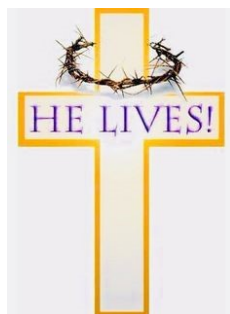
This "All Age Worship" service at our church, starting at 10.00 am, will be led by Marilyn Dore.

Women's World Day of Prayer

We made coffee before 11 am and enjoyed a beautifully decorated fruit cake, made by one of the members from St Theresa's Church. Following refreshments we proceeded to St Theresa's Church and, seated in a circle where the choir usually sits, shared a simplified version of the service, 'All God's Creation is Very Good', written by the women of Suriname, the focus being the abuse of our planet and living creatures, particularly through our use of plastic. The readings were shared between most ladies present and all joined in the singing of the first and last hymns. The first being "O Lord My God", and the last was, as is traditional, "The Day thou Gavest Lord is Ended", both unaccompanied! The Circuit is a group of 18 churches mainly located in Buckinghamshire and the Community Centre is a thriving town-centre meeting venue.

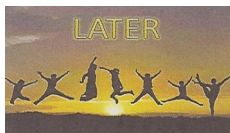

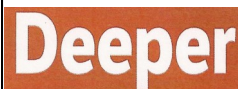
