## From the Manse ...



As I write this my dad and I are clearing the house of my aunty Bunty who passed away in January. She was a lovely lady who reached the age of 96. I remember her as a tidy lady and her house seemed to be quite the same with a few pieces of crockery neatly displayed. However, as we looked through cupboards and wardrobes we began to find hoards and hoards of stuff, seemingly enough crockery and clothing and bedding and food to fill the house to the brim – and that was before we went out to the shed!

When you step back from what appears to be, and take a look at the bigger picture we see how easy it is to accumulate so much clutter!

That reminded me of a colleague Chris Gardner who preached on Luke 9:2-4 *and he sent them out to preach the kingdom of God and to heal the sick. He told them: "take nothing for the journey – no staff, no bag, no bread, no money, no extra tunic."*

Jesus sent the disciples out with nothing but the gospel. Chris suggested that in our present age we seem to live a gospel that is cluttered. Cluttered with our individual experiences, with our individual interpretations and if we are not careful, our own truths. We can be so wrapped up in the detail of the message that we forget to look at the bigger picture, i.e. what the message actually is – which is this;

That Jesus came to give life to all and that we might live that life to the full, here and now, not in the future. The liberation that Jesus offers is that we can be who he calls us to be right now. Our lives can sometimes become so cluttered that we lose sight of this wonderful message.

It's easy to clean my auntie's house and throw away some of the rubbish, but what about our lives? As we approach Lent we have the opportunity to take a step back and reflect on the bigger picture. Who is this Jesus and what does he mean to me in my life? and, is there any clutter in my life that is stopping me being the person he wants me to be?

### Silent Prayers

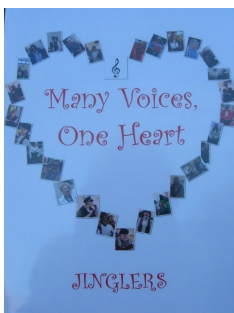
The next meeting will be at St. Dunstan's Church Hall, on Monday 12<sup>th</sup> March at 8pm.

This helps to balance client numbers as, unfortunately, we regularly lose clients when they pass away or become too unwell and have to go to live in a nursing home.

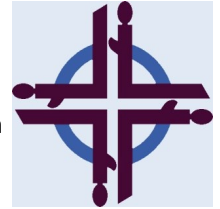
Lighthouse Quiz Night.

### Later Group for 11-18 year olds

Whilst a number of our older teenagers moved on at the end of the last school year, we have welcomed 3 newcomers to the group.

The meetings offer table tennis, table-top football, snooker, giant Jenga and the wii, plus our lovely large grass area outside to run around in. There are additional activities and challenges as and when we think of them! In January we had a trip to the bowling alley in Aylesbury, travelling there and back in the Community Bus which was driven by Peter Willett, and was greatly enjoyed by everyone.



At the end of each evening there is a 'God Slot' when we rely on a member of the clergy from different churches in the town to provide a 10 minute thought-provoking activity or discussion. Ryan Romano from St. Mary's Church attends each Later Group meeting and works directly with the young people and has a good relationship with them. Princes & Monks Risborough, Longwick, Bledlows, Kimbles, Ellesborough and Speen

The Risborough Area Community Bus runs regular services Monday to Saturday mornings. We serve three routes around Monks Risborough, Trees and Fields (the estate behind Marks and Spencer) and out to Longwick every day. We also serve outlying villages - Mondays, Thursdays and Saturdays there are two services to The Kimbles and Ellesborough via Monks Risborough and Askett; Tuesdays we serve Speen and Wednesday and Friday Bledlow Village and Bledlow Ridge.

It is a 'Hail and Ride' scheduled service picking up and dropping off passengers anywhere along the route. Timetables are available at the Library, on the bus or visit our website, [www.racb.co.uk](http://www.racb.co.uk) for more information (including a detailed route map).

Anyone can use the bus; concessionary Passes are accepted and children under the age of 16 travel free; for anyone else a small charge of £1.50 per journey or £2.00 on the village routes.

## RISBOROUGH PARKING REVIEW - 2018

The general consensus is that the new parking restrictions introduced in some roads last year has been a great success in easing parking problems. Indeed, many residents from other roads have asked if parking restrictions could be introduced in their roads where they consider inconsiderate parking now occurs. The parking committee, consisting of road representatives, PRTC and Risborough Area Community Bus, and led by our County Councillor, has drawn up draft proposals for informal consultation with town residents to gauge their views. The following roads have been identified for possible implementation of parking restrictions:

- a. **The Retreat, Highfield Rd, Berryfield Rd, St Teresas Close, The Avenue, Crossfield Rd and Little Park.**
- b. **Shortborough Ave, Westmead, Berndine Rise and Windsor Hill.**
- c. **Longwick Rd to Railway Bridge, Brook Rd, Cannon Place and Pursell Place.**
- e. **Clifford Rd, Culverton Hill and Merton Rd.**
- f. **High Street.**
- g. **Fields and Trees Estates.**
- h. **Willow Way.**
- i. **Residential Parking Permit Areas.**
- j. **Wellington Avenue. To consider** double yellow lines outside Windsor Lodge.
- k. **Mill Lane and St Dunstan's Close.**
- l. **The Fairway.**

The Committee will hold an informal consultation with town residents on 7<sup>th</sup> March in St. Mary's Church Hall, Church Street, between 3-8pm to test reaction. There is also the option to email [risborough.parking.review2018@gmail.com](mailto:risborough.parking.review2018@gmail.com). Once informal consultation has been completed, proposals will be submitted to Transport for Buckinghamshire for costing.
