From the Manse ...



Dear Friends,

As someone who drives around in a car a lot I am increasingly noticing that as I go through a traffic light on amber there seem to be at least 3 more cars behind me when I reach the other side of the lights. Whilst reading my daily devotions I came across this story;

A good citizen was being followed too close by a stressed-out woman on a busy street. Suddenly, the light at the junction just in front of them turned amber. The good citizen did the right thing by stopping at the crossing – even though he could have beaten the red light by racing through it.

The woman behind him hit the roof — and her horn. She was screaming in frustration because she had missed her chance to get through the lights. As she was still in mid-rant — alternately pounding the steering wheel and gesturing to the man in front of her — she heard a tap on her window and looked up into the face of a very serious police officer. The officer ordered her to exit her car with her hands up. He put handcuffs on her, took her to the police station, where she was searched, fingerprinted, photographed, and placed in a cell. After a couple of hours, a police officer approached the cell and opened the door. The woman was escorted back to the front desk where the arresting officer was waiting with her personal effects. He said, "I'm very sorry for my mistake. You see, I pulled up behind your car while you were tooting your horn and shouting at the man in front. Then I noticed the 'What Would Jesus Do?' bumper sticker, the 'Follow Me to Sunday School' bumper sticker, and the chrome-plated Christian fish emblem on the boot. Naturally, I assumed you had stolen the car."

Ouch! Have you seen anyone behaving like that? I wonder sometimes whether there is a thought that we can come to Church and behave one way, and for the rest of the week we can be "just like everybody else." But in the book of Acts, Jesus calls us to be his witnesses 24/7. We all have parts of our lives that we try to keep to ourselves – perhaps over the summer you might find time to reflect on those areas you have yet to give to Jesus and ask for his help and strength to offer your whole life to him.

The 'Cake and Plant' stall for Wycombe Homeless Connection (WHC) held on Sunday, 29th April raised £150 for WHC, so well done to all the contributors and those who came to buy the goods.

Vic Baker did an excellent job in raising awareness of the work of WHC, which is a Christian-based charity, which provides every day advice and support, runs workshops to address the underlying issues of homelessness, and during the three coldest months of the year provides twelve shelter places administered on a rota basis by seven churches in Wycombe.

Many volunteers are involved with a small paid staff of support workers, so that costs are kept to a minimum; around £200,000 last year.

Over 500 people went to WHC for help last year. WHC says that "Every homeless individual in High Wycombe has worth and should have the chance of a fresh start whatever their situation."

Tuesday Fellowship

At our meeting in April our speaker was Rev. Peter Viney. He told us about his work with the Nuns of The Community of St. John Baptist, also known as the Sisters of Mercy. For the last 19 years Peter has served as Bursar to the Sisters, managing their finances and, amongst many other things, masterminding their two big moves from Clewer Windsor to Begbroke and more recently to Cuddesdon.

The Community was founded in 1852 by Harriet Monsell, a clergyman's widow from Windsor. The purpose of the order was to help marginalised women, mainly single mothers, the homeless and sex-trade workers, by providing them shelter and teaching them a trade. This work then expanded to include administer and working with orphanages, schools, convalescent hospitals, soup kitchens and women's hostels.



This work continues today making

grants towards improving education, reducing homelessness, supporting refugees, and rescuing people from modern day slavery and sex work. Here are some websites that show the wonderful work in which they are engaged:
